NSTAR, the largest Massachusetts-based, investor-owned electric and gas utility, is hoping its customers are just as committed to helping the environment as the company is. With more and more consumers looking for ways to "go green," NSTAR is giving its customers a unique opportunity.

E-Bill, NSTAR's electronic billing service, has always given customers the option of paperless billing. But, more recently, they've added an additional green incentive for customers to go paperless.

The new campaign encourages customers to receive their bills online and, in turn, NSTAR will donate to the Massachusetts Department of Conservation & Recreation (DCR). The DCR is the steward to one of the largest state parks systems in the country. Their mission is "to protect, promote and enhance our commonwealth of natural, cultural and recreational resources."

For every customer that signs up for NSTAR's E-Bill and goes paperless between May 21 and July 31, 2008, NSTAR will donate \$1 to the DCR. The NSTAR Go Green Grants will be administered by the DCR and designated specifically for NSTAR communities.

"NSTAR is committed to conducting its business in a way that least impacts the environment," said Paul Sellers, senior arborist for NSTAR. "This program not only helps save a few trees, it gives us the opportunity to give back directly to our communities through tree-friendly grants."

NSTAR Go Green Grants will be used for community tree replacement planting and building local capacity for excellent urban and community forestry.
